It appears from the Books on file in this Office, that Charles Abbey was enrolled on the 11th day of December 1862, at Fort Cass in Co. "A", Fourteenth Regiment of Wisconsin Volunteers, to serve three years, or during the war, and mustered into service as a Private on the 11th day of January 1863, at Milwaukee, in Co. "A", Fourteenth Regiment of Wisconsin Volunteers, to serve three years, or during the war. On the Muster Roll of Co. "A" of that Regiment, for the months of May & June 1863, he is reported "Killed in battle near Vicksburg May 22nd 63".

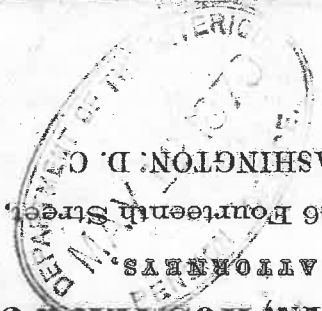
