for the term of one year was mustered into the military service of the United States  
on the 16<sup>th</sup> day of February, 1865,  
at Madison, Wis.

and Discharged  
on the 26<sup>th</sup> day of September, 1865, at St. Louis, Mo.

The records further show that said soldier when enlisted was 17 years of age single,  
had blue eyes, light hair, light complexion, was 5  
feet 4 inches in height, and by occupation a farmer.
