



She also gave the following account of how the robbery took place. She stated that the Suspect entered the bank, went to the Courtes; table mear the front door of the bank which is an entranceway onto N.E. 122md. He then came to her window, handed her a paper bag and note. In essence, the note stated, "This is a holdup. I have a gun. I wom't hesitate to shoot if I have to. " He then gave her the brown paper beg and told her to place all the bills into the bag. Mrs. Roach stated that she attempted to stall by rattling the bag and tried to draw attention in this manner also. She then placed all of the paper money in her teller's cage into the bag, and handed it back to the Suspect. The Suspect them left the bank the same way in which he came, through the front doors of the bank. She also stated that the Suspect opened his jacket at one time, showing her the butt of a gum protruding from an inside pocket of the jacket. When asked to describe the gum, she stated that it appeared to be silver with scroll work on the grips. She also stated that he reached for this gum with his right hand.

Witness #1, Mr. Pingle, stated that he had also seen the holdup man, and gave the Writer approximately the same description as the Victim Mrs. Roach. He stated that he is the party who punched the alarm button.

Mr. Domelson stated that he was standing directly behind Mrs. Roach's teller's cage, and saw the man hand her the paper bag. He did not see any weapon but believed that he could pickethe man out of any line-up. He emphatically stated that he would recognize the man if he saw him again.

At this point, the F.B.I. personnel arrived at the scene and took over the investigation. Writer then proceeded to N.E. 125th and Schuyler where the 1970 Chevrolet station wagon had been found by Officer Dennis Carmody. At this point I contacted Agent McLeod of the F.B.I. who showed Writer a Brescia Rigaru 22 caliber automatic pistol, serial #49134, blue finish with white grips. This pistol was found on the passenger side of the 1960 Chev station wagon on the floor. It is now in the possession of Agent McLeod.

Sgt. Thacker also located a brass button at the base of the south curb of N.E. Schuyler, approximately 15 feet east of the Suspect Auto. It is the belief of this Writer and Agent McLeod that the button came from the jacket which was worn by the Suspect. Agent McLeod had several agents canvassing the neighborhood where the 1960 Chevrolet wagon was located, and came up with two other witnesses who saw the Suspect get out of the 1960 Chevrolet and into Suspect Auto #2.
