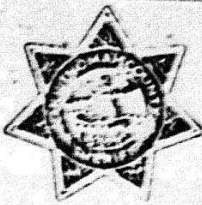



SUBJECT: VEHICLE DISPOSAL REQUEST OF DECEMBER 26, 1972

Your request for review of vehicle disposal proposal pursuant to Ordinance 24 concerning five cars presently held at Edgefield has resulted in the following opinion:

(1) 1962 CHEVROLET S/W, Montana License No. 5-10897.  
Note license plate discrepancy between that on the car and the number carried by the Montana Motor Vehicles Department. A 9/22/71 letter from the registered owner indicates the car was sold for junk without the license plates. If it can be confirmed that the vehicle was not resold and relicensed, but that the plates on the car were stolen or switched plates, then you have exhausted all reasonable efforts to notify the owner. A simpler means to check would be to advise the Helena, Montana, wrecking company to whom the registered owner sold the car. Depending on any response, or lack thereof, you would then be able to proceed under the ordinance. In other words, we have not yet expended all reasonable efforts to notify the legal owner and I recommend we defer action pending further investigation.

(2) 1954 CHEVROLET, 4-Dr. Sedan, Oregon License 1H-5208.  
You may proceed to transfer custody under No. 24.

  
(3) 1960 CHEVROLET S/W, Oregon License KDG 729.  
Except for possible typographical error in teletype upon which notice to the owner was based resulting in returned mail for "No such number", it appears every reasonable effort has been made to notify the owner. A confirming teletype might be appropriate since we all know there's no such address as indicated and we may be accused of negligence in performing our duty to furnish notice if the owner turns up after sale. (For example, Portland

telephone book lists a "Summers, 17400 E. Burnside.) Should Salem furnish the same erroneous address, then you may proceed under the ordinance.

(4) 1962 PLYMOUTH SEDAN, Oregon License No. 40-6108.  
Reasonable effort to give notice satisfied; auto may be processed under the ordinance.

(5) 1962 FORD THUNDERBIRD, Oregon License No. LEZ 650.  
Qualifies under the ordinance; may now be processed.

Attached are copies concerning five (5) motor vehicles that are currently located at Edgefield Manor that have been in our possession in excess of thirty days. 

Your request for review of vehicle disposal proposal pursuant to Ordinance 24 concerning five cars presently held at Edgefield has resulted in the following opinion:

71-17708 / (1) 1962 CHEVROLET S/W. Montana License No. 5-10897.  
Note license plate discrepancy between that on the car and the number carried by the Montana Motor Vehicles Department. A 9/22/71 letter from the registered owner indicates the car was sold for junk without the license plates. If it can be confirmed that the vehicle was not resold and relicensed, but that the plates on the car were stolen or switched plates, then you have exhausted all reasonable efforts to notify the owner. A simpler means to check would be to advise the Helena, Montana, wrecking company to whom the registered owner sold the car. Depending on any response, or lack thereof, you would then be able to proceed under the ordinance. In other words, we have not yet expended all reasonable efforts to notify the legal owner and I recommend we defer action pending further investigation.

You may proceed to transfer custody under No. 24.

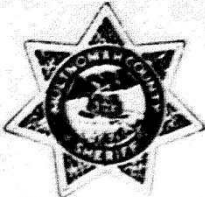

Total amount of money taken unknown at this writing.

At approximately 3:45 PM, Writer arrived at the First National Bank located approximately one block north of Halsey St. on the east side of 122nd.

Officer Hansen was contacted in the conference room of the bank where he was

interviewing Mrs. Bernita Roach, the Victim. At this time she gave Officer Hansen and I the above described description of the holdup man. She also gave the following account of how the robbery took place. She stated that the Suspect entered the bank, went to the Courtesy table near the front door of the bank which is an entranceway onto N.E. 122nd. He then came to her window, handed her a paper bag and note. In essence, the note stated, "This is a holdup. I have a gun. I won't hesitate to shoot if I have to." He then gave her the brown paper bag and told her to place all the bills into the bag. Mrs. Roach stated that she attempted to stall by rattling the bag and tried to draw attention in this manner also. She then placed all of the paper money in her teller's cage into the bag, and handed it back to the Suspect. The Suspect then left the bank the same way in which he came, through the front doors of the bank. She also stated that the Suspect opened his jacket at one time, showing her the butt of a gun protruding from an inside pocket of the jacket. When asked to describe the gun, she stated that it appeared to be silver with scroll work on the grips. She also stated that he reached for this gun with his right hand.

Witness #1, Mr. Pingle, stated that he had also seen the holdup man, and gave the Writer approximately the same description as the Victim Mrs. Roach. He stated that he is the party who punched the alarm button.

Mr. Donelson stated that he was standing directly behind Mrs. Roach's teller's cage, and saw the man hand her the paper bag. He did not see any weapon but believed that he could pick the man out of any line-up. He emphatically stated that he would recognize the man if he saw him again.

At this point, the F.B.I. personnel arrived at the scene and took over the investigation. Writer then proceeded to N.E. 125th and Schuyler where the 1970 Chevrolet station wagon had been found by Officer Dennis Carmody. At this point I contacted Agent McLeod of the F.B.I. who showed Writer a Brescia Rigaru 22 caliber automatic pistol, serial #49134, blue finish with white grips. This pistol was found on the passenger side of the 1960 Chev station wagon on the floor. It is now in the possession of Agent McLeod.

Sgt. Thacker also located a brass button at the base of the south curb of N.E. Schuyler, approximately 15 feet east of the Suspect Auto. It is the belief of this Writer and Agent McLeod that the button came from the jacket which was worn by the Suspect. Agent McLeod had several agents canvassing the neighborhood where the 1960 Chevrolet wagon was located, and came up with two other witnesses who saw the Suspect get out of the 1960 Chevrolet and into Suspect Auto #2. This vehicle was last seen in the area of N.E. 129th and Halsey. Also found in the 1960 Chevrolet, was a pink money coupon from the gas station located on the N.E. corner of 92 and Holgate. Agents

from the F.B.I. proceeded to 92 and Holgate to check this out, apparently learned nothing further than that the vehicle has been in to this gas station. It may be noted at this point that the Writer has seen this vehicle several times in the Lents area of Portland. Feelers were put out to several informants as to who may own the vehicle or a vehicle of the description of Suspect Vehicle #2.

Investigation turned over to Federal Bureau of Investigation at this time.
